5. OR I, 7, page 109. Fogg's rank is variously given as Lt., Capt., and Maj. (Listed as Capt. In *Tennesseans in the Civil War, Part 2*). Fogg's initials confirmed by entries in Zollicoffer (1861-62). Fogg may not have died on the field. A 28 January 1862 article in the Memphis *Daily Avalanche* said he was severely wounded in the hip, and had been taken to McMinnville, TN. Shields was a Pvt. In Co. C, 20th Tenn. Inf. (McMurray (1904), page101), but his Compiled Service Record in the National Archives (CSR, NA) shows that he was promoted to 2nd Lt. in the Corps of Cavalry, CS Regular Army, 24 December 1861. As such, he served on Zollicoffer's staff.
